Lesson Review Questions

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Leader's Note: Reword questions to better suit the developmental age level of the students you're working with or to better fit the game/activity. They can be revised to be multiple choice, true or false, or fill in the blank. The purpose of the review questions is to reinforce what students have learned, not to stump students. Incorrect answers should always be kindly and positively corrected, so all students clearly hear the correct answer. *Note: Lesson Review Cards are available in the appendix.*

Lesson 1

1. Why did so many people come to see Jesus? (To hear Him preach and to be healed)
2. Why did the four friends bring their friend to Jesus? (For him to be healed from being paralyzed)
3. When they couldn't get to Jesus because of the crowd, what did the four friends do? (They took their paralyzed friend to the roof, made an opening, and lowered him to see Jesus)
4. When did Jesus forgive the paralyzed man's sins? (When Jesus saw his and his four friends' faith)
5. When the Jewish teachers didn't believe Jesus was God, what did Jesus do? (He healed the paralyzed man so he could walk again)
6. What is more important: to be healed from something that's wrong with your body, or to be forgiven of your sin? (To be forgiven of your sin)
7. What example did the four friends give to us? (The importance and urgency of bringing others to Jesus)
8. Name some ways you can bring others to Jesus. (Pray for them, invite them to church, share the Gospel with them, etc.)

Lesson 2

1. Who was Jairus? (A Jewish leader)
2. Why did Jairus come to Jesus? (He wanted Jesus to heal his dying daughter)
3. What happened when Jesus was on the way to heal Jairus' daughter? (Jesus stopped to talk to a woman; because of her faith, Jesus used His great power to heal her from her sickness)
4. How did Jesus encourage Jairus after his daughter died? (He said, "Don't be afraid; just believe")
5. What did people at Jairus' house do when Jesus said the little girl wasn't dead but asleep? (They laughed)
6. What did Jesus do for Jairus' dead daughter? (He told her to get up; she stood up and walked around)
7. Did Jairus depend on Jesus' great power? (Yes)
8. Name some ways you can depend on Jesus' great power.

Lesson 3

1. What is a tradition? (A man-made rule or a special way someone always does things)
2. Can following traditions very carefully help a person get to heaven? (No)
3. What word describes the result of growing to be more like Jesus? (Holiness)
4. What does it mean to be a hypocrite? (To pretend like you're living God's way when you're really not)
5. What kind of attitude does God want us to have as we try to become more like Jesus? (Humble)
6. When people around us are not following our traditions, or even when they are sinning, should we go around pointing out all their mistakes? (No, we should show them mercy/Jesus' love)
7. What are some good traditions we can have that will help us grow in holiness? (Read the Bible, pray before eating, come to church every week, etc.)

Lesson 4

1. When Jesus was told Lazarus was sick, how long did He wait to go to Lazarus? (Two days)
2. What had already happened to Lazarus before Jesus went to him? (He had died)
3. How did Jesus feel about Martha, Mary, and Lazarus? (He loved them)
4. Even though this was a bad time for Martha and Mary, what did they do? (They trusted in Jesus)
5. How long was Lazarus in the tomb when Jesus got there? (Four days)
6. What did Jesus do at the tomb? (He raised Lazarus from the dead)
7. Name some bad times in your life. Do you trust in Jesus no matter what?
8. When you've trusted in Jesus as your Savior, do you feel hope because you know Jesus loves you and you will live again forever, even when you die?

Lesson 5

1. In today's lesson, what are two important things that Jesus knew? (It was almost time for Him to die, and Judas was going to betray Him)
2. Even though God had given Jesus power over everything, what did Jesus do? (He washed His disciples' feet)
3. At first, which disciple didn't want Jesus to wash his feet? (Peter)
4. When Jesus said a clean person still needs to wash his feet, He meant a saved person still needs to do what? (Humbly admit when they've sinned)
5. When Jesus washed His disciples' feet, what example was He giving to His disciples? (Humbly serving others)
6. Name some ways you can humbly serve others.
7. Why should you serve others? (1 Corinthians 15:58)

Lesson 6

1. What did Jesus say the disciples would do? (They would run away and leave Him)
2. What did Jesus say Peter would do before the rooster crowed twice? (He would lie three times about knowing Jesus)
3. What did the disciples do when Jesus was arrested? (They ran away and left Jesus alone)
4. What did Peter do when people said he was one of Jesus' disciples? (He lied three times before the rooster crowed twice)
5. What did Jesus do to help Peter? (He prayed that Peter's faith would not fail and, when he turned back to Jesus, he would strengthen the other disciples)
6. How did Peter feel after he lied about Jesus? (He was very sad, and he ran out and cried bitterly)
7. Will you boldly tell others that you believe in Jesus? Why or why not?

Lesson 7

1. What had Jesus told the disciples would happen on the third day after He died? (He would rise from the dead)
2. What did Jesus do on the third day after He died? (He rose from the dead)
3. Who saw Jesus after He rose from the dead? (Peter, the disciples, and over 500 other believers)
4. What did Jesus do to show that He had risen from the dead, and He was really alive? (He ate fish, He talked to His disciples, the tomb was empty, He showed His disciples His scars, He did miracles)
5. Do you believe that Jesus is alive, even today?
6. How can you tell others this Good News?

Lesson 8

1. What did Jesus do with the disciples while He was still on earth? (Showed them proof that He is alive, taught the disciples)
2. What did Jesus promise the disciples before He returned to heaven? (They would receive the Holy Spirit)
3. Where did Jesus go? (Heaven)
4. What did the angels tell the disciples? (Jesus would return the same way He left)
5. What did the disciples do after Jesus returned to heaven? (Prayed and prepared to be witnesses)
6. How did God equip the disciples to be witnesses? (He gave them the Holy Spirit)
7. What is the Church Age? (The time from Pentecost until Jesus comes back)

Lesson 9

1. How did people in the early Church help the disciples? (They would sell land and homes and give the disciples the money to live on while they were telling people about Jesus)
2. When Ananias and Sapphira sold their property, what did they do with the money? (They kept part for themselves, and they gave part to the disciples)
3. What did Ananias and Sapphira want people to think? (They gave all the money to the disciples)
4. Was it a sin for Ananias and Sapphira to keep part of the money? (No)
5. What did Ananias and Sapphira do that was a sin? (They lied to God)
6. What happened to Ananias and Sapphira? (They died)
7. What happened to the disciples and the Church? (The disciples did many miracles, they told people about Jesus, so more people believed, and the Church grew)
8. Are you determined to tell the truth?

Lesson 10

1. Who was Stephen? (One of the disciples' seven helpers)
2. Why did the disciples need help? (The Church was growing very fast)
3. What did the Jewish religious leaders accuse Stephen of? (Blasphemy – being disrespectful to God)
4. What did Stephen explain to the religious leaders? (He explained God's special plan and the truth about what the religious leaders did to Jesus, God's Son)
5. What did the religious leaders do to Stephen when he told them the truth about Jesus? (They stoned him to death)
6. What did Stephen say to God before he died? (He told God not to hold their sin of stoning him against them)
7. Where did Stephen go when he died? (Heaven)
8. Are you ready to stand firm and confidently tell everyone the truth about Jesus?

Lesson 11

1. What happened to Jesus' disciples right after Stephen was stoned to death? (They were scattered to other places)
2. Who did God want Philip to meet? (The Ethiopian man)
3. Did the Ethiopian man believe in God? How do you know? (Yes, he had been to Jerusalem to worship God, and he was reading God's Word)
4. What problem did the Ethiopian man have? (He couldn't understand God's Word)
5. What did God want Philip to do for the Ethiopian man? (Explain how Jesus could save him from his sin)
6. What happened when Philip told the Ethiopian man about Jesus? (He believed and was baptized)
7. Why did the Ethiopian man want to be baptized? (To show that he believed in Jesus)
8. Are you ready to serve God?

Review Day: No new review questions

Topical Lesson: Easter - Good News

1. How do you know God loves us? (John 3:16a, "For God so loved the world that He gave His one and only Son...")
2. God sent His one and only perfect Son to die for our sin. What was His name? (Jesus)
3. Is Jesus still dead on the cross? (No, He is alive today!)
4. Have you sinned? What sins do kids your age struggle with?
5. Have you asked Jesus to forgive your sin and be the one true leader of your life?
6. How can you grow to be more like Jesus? (Attend church, read your Bible, pray, etc.)

Topical Lesson: Heaven

1. True or false: People turn into angels when they get to heaven. (False)
2. What does eternity mean? (Forever)
3. Can being really, really good get you into heaven? (No)
4. Who will be in heaven? (All who believed in Jesus as their Savior when they were on earth)
5. Into what two groups will Jesus divide people? (Those who believe in Him and those who don't)
6. What is the punishment for sin? (Death, separation from God forever)

On Track Map Review Questions

Y3 – Q3

Missions

Purpose: To challenge students to think globally and to review the Mission Lessons from this past school year.

Sample questions:

- What country or people group have you prayed for this week?
- Why are missionaries important?
- What are some challenges of being a missionary?
- What are three ways we can help with missions? (Pray, give, go)
- After watching the news this week, what country should we pray for this week? (End your time with prayer for this country)

OT vs NT – People specific

Purpose: To teach students where to find specific people in the Bible – the Old Testament or the New Testament.

Samples:

- Moses: OT
- Peter: NT
- Mary, mother of Jesus: NT
- Noah: OT
- Adam and Eve: OT
- Jesus' birth: NT
- Abraham: OT
- Miracles Jesus did: NT

Sample questions:

- Name a person in the Old Testament who was a role model of how to stand firm? (Daniel, Joseph, Noah, Ruth, Esther, etc.)
- Name a person in the New Testament who was a role model on how to stand firm? (John the Baptist, Stephen, Paul, Joseph, Mary, etc.)

Top 12 – Know and Use

Purpose: To lock in the full Top 12 verses and references and understand how to apply them.

Sample questions:

1. What verse talks about loving your neighbor? (Mark 12:30-31 – “Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength.” The second is this: “Love your neighbor as yourself.” There is no commandment greater than these.)
2. What verse challenges us to stand firm? (1 Corinthians 15:58 – Therefore, my dear brothers, stand firm. Let nothing move you. Always give yourselves fully to the work of the Lord, because you know that your labor in the Lord is not in vain.)
3. What verse makes it clear that you can't get to heaven by your own good works? (Ephesians 2:8-9 – For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith – and this not from yourselves, it is the gift of God – not by works, so that no one can boast.)

4. What verse tells us that heaven is a real place? (John 14:2 – In my Father’s house are many rooms; if it were not so, I would have told you. I am going there to prepare a place for you.)
5. What verse tells us that God loves us? (John 3:16 – For God so loved the world that He gave His one and only Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish but have eternal life.)
6. What verse tells us that all people sin? (Romans 3:23 – For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God.)
7. What verse explains why Jesus had to shed His blood so that we could be forgiven for our sins? (Hebrews 9:22b – ...and without the shedding of blood there is no forgiveness.)
8. What verse tells us why we should go to church? (2 Peter 3:18a – But grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.)
9. What verse tells us that Jesus is the only way to heaven? (John 14:6 – Jesus answered, “I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through Me.”)
10. What verse tells us why we should trust in God? (Proverbs 3:5-6 – Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways acknowledge Him, and He will make your paths straight.)
11. What verse should I recite when I’m afraid? (Joshua 1:9 – Have I not commanded you? Be strong and courageous. Do not be terrified; do not be discouraged, for the Lord your God will be with you wherever you go.)
12. What verse explains how a person can be saved? (Acts 16:31 – Believe in the Lord Jesus, and you will be saved—you and your household.)

Pre-Service Review Game

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Option 1: Plinko!

Big Idea: Students will play a fun Plinko game. The team with the most points will win. An example of someone playing Plinko can be found here: <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=tNd8JaAXHic>

Supplies:

- Giant Plinko board; basic instructions can be found at: <https://drowland.wordpress.com/2012/11/16/plinko-game-construction/> (the options at the bottom of the board should be a mix of points and special prizes)
- Game “pucks”
- Special prizes such as candy or Tracker Tickets
- Whiteboard or some other way to keep track of points

Instructions:

1. The game should begin 15 minutes before the start of the hour or when each team has two players.
2. Divide students into two teams, such as boys vs. girls.
3. The Worship Leader should ask Lesson Review questions or On Track Map questions (see appendix) and select a student who raises their hand to answer the question. If they answer correctly, they will get a puck for the Plinko game. The student comes up on stage and drops the puck into the game, earning either a prize or points for their team. If they give an incorrect answer, allow the other team to answer. If they answer correctly, they will earn a puck for the Plinko game. If both teams give incorrect answers, announce the correct answer and move on to the next question.
4. When time is up, the team with the most points is the winner.

Option 2: Beanbag Toss

Big Idea: Students will answer questions as they play a beanbag toss game. The team with the most points at the end wins.

Supplies:

- 20 beanbags (10 of each color)
- A target to toss the beanbags into such as a bucket or: <https://www.hayneedle.com/product/beanbagtoss.cfm>
- Whiteboard and marker (to keep track of points)
- Painter’s tape (to make a throwing line)

Instructions:

1. Divide students into two teams.
2. Allow teams to answer questions. When a student answers a question correctly, they should be given a beanbag in their team’s color.
3. After five minutes or when all beanbags are given out, all those with beanbags stand behind a designated line and toss their beanbag into the target at the same time.
4. Add up the points and write them on the team scoreboard.
5. Repeat as time permits.

Bonus Mission Lessons

An option for classes that visit the Mission Station twice

Option A: Around the World Challenge

Supplies:

- World maps or globes (one per team)
- Magnetic shapes and/or letters
- Magnetic wall*
- Tracker Tickets or a treat from around the world (for the winning team)

*Alternate ideas if you don't have a magnetic wall:

- Have teams use magnetic letters or shapes to write the names on the floor or on tables (directly on the floor or tables, or on poster boards or roll paper).
- Have teams use toothpicks or popsicle sticks to write the names on the floor or on tables (directly on the floor or tables, or on poster boards or roll paper).
- Have teams create a poster on a large poster board with John 3:16 and names of countries from around the world. Award Tracker Tickets or treats to either the team with the most creative poster or the poster with the most countries listed. (Decide the criteria for the winning team in advance.)



Instructions:

1. Divide students into teams.
2. Give each team a world map.
3. Say: Can you guess how many countries there are around the world? (About 200; *give three Tracker Tickets for the closest guess*) Did you know God loves every single person and knows the number of hairs on each of their heads? He loves them so much that He sent His one and only Son to die for them. How do we know this? (John 3:16 and Matthew 10:30; *give three Tracker Tickets if students answer correctly*) This means no matter where you go on this earth, Jesus died for those people. The question is, has every person heard the Good News of Jesus? Let's stop and think about the countries around the world. To do this, we are going to do the "Around the World Challenge." Your goal, as a team, is to write as many names as possible of different countries using magnet shapes and/or letters in 8 minutes. (Hint: Students may want to look for countries with short names)
4. Team with the most countries will win three Tracker Tickets each or a treat from around the world.
5. After the winning team is announced, have students stop and pick a country to pray for. Pray that God will protect the Christians in that country and that the Gospel will be proclaimed clearly to all the people.

Option B: Around the World Challenge

Print a copy of country flags from around the world for each team.

Using magnetic shapes, have teams try to create as many flags as possible using the correct colors.

Bulletin Boards

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Graffiti Board

Write in bold big letters, “What did I discover today?” Each week as parents are picking up students, have students share with the DT Leader what they learned. If a student gives a good answer, have the DT Leader write it on the Bulletin Board. By the end of the quarter, the Bulletin Board should look like a graffiti board of answers.

Class Picture

At the top of the bulletin board, use large letters or write the title, “Our Eternal Family”. Take several pictures of students in the class and attach them to the bulletin board. Encourage students to write the date or year when they were saved next to their picture.

Worship Plan: K-2nd

Note: Close Worship Time with prayer before dismissing to Discover Time.

Lesson 1

Transition 1: When you know Jesus as your Savior, it's like carrying around a light. Every time you share Jesus and His free gift of salvation with someone, your light shines bolder and brighter! So kids, are you ready to shine?!

Song 1: "Shine"

Transition 2: Bolder and brighter for Jesus, friends! I want the whole world to know Jesus, to know and believe Acts 16:31! Do you guys know Acts 16:31? Let's hear it! (*start song as they finish verse*)

Song 2: "Tell the World"

Transition 3: Pray with me. Lord, the Bible tells of Your amazing love and power! You heal the hurt and save the lost! You alone are worthy of our praises. We lift up our voices and our hands to You and You alone. In Jesus' name, Amen. (*start song as amen is being said*)

Song 3: "Only Jesus"

Lesson 2

Transition 1: God is all-powerful; there's nothing too big for God! No matter what you are worried about or scared about, no matter how big your problem is, God can help you!

Song 1: "Tell the World"

Transition 2: Take a look at our Bible verse today, Psalm 147:5. *Read the verse from your Bible.* Our God is great, powerful, and nothing is beyond His understanding. I want you to know that no matter how bad things may seem at the moment, He is with you in a powerful way!! God is faithful to help us even in our hardest times!

Song 2: "Give Me a J"

Transition 3: This song is Isaiah 41:10 and it teaches us that we don't have to fear anything because God is with us! Psalm 147:5 teaches us our God is great, powerful, and mighty! Wow, you put those two teachings together and you have the perfect reason to worship!

Song 3: "Do Not Fear"

Lesson 3

Transition 1: In the Bible, in Micah 6:8, it says "He has showed you, O man, what is good. And what does the Lord require of you? To act justly and to love mercy and to walk humbly with your God." When we walk humbly with our God, we remember that He is the most important and we do things His way. This is how we become more like Jesus!

Song 1: "Give Me a J"

Transition 2: When we walk humbly with our God and follow Him, we think about and do whatever is right and whatever is pure. Don't ever stop living for truth and spreading the light of Jesus!

Song 2: "Don't Ever Stop"

Transition 3: Join me in praying. Jesus, all I can say is I want my life to be a reflection of You. It's all about you, Jesus, only You. In Jesus' name, Amen.

Song 3: "Only Jesus"

Lesson 4

Transition 1: Can life be really hard sometimes? Maybe your parents are getting a divorce, or your best friend doesn't want to be friends anymore. Maybe you get bullied every day or someone you love is very sick. Maybe you feel a little discouraged. Friends, this is when we must choose to worship God! Our God is holy and loving. Our God is good even when everything else feels bad. Our God is good! Lord, we choose to lift Your name on high in every circumstance - good or bad!

Song 1: "Lord I Lift Your Name on High"

Transition 2: Jesus is trustworthy. Do you know what that means? He will always be with you, and He will never fail you, and He will never leave you. So, when life gets hard, we need to remember these promises and let the truth of God's Word shine in us!

Song 2: "Shine"

Transition 3: Jesus, we are here to worship You.

Song 3: "Only Jesus"

Lesson 5

Transition 1: Do you remember what it means to be humble? When you are humble, you think of others first. Humble is the opposite of selfish or prideful. *(pause)* When Jesus came to earth and died on the cross for our sins, He showed us what it truly means to be a humble servant.

Song 1: "Lord I Lift Your Name on High"

Transition 2: Even though Jesus is God, He chose to be humble and to serve others. He washed the disciples' dirty feet, and He gave His life so your sins could be forgiven. He did all of this because of His great love for you. I want everyone to know Jesus' awesome love, do you?! Let me hear you shout, "Jesus!"

Song 2: "Tell the World"

Transition 3: Lord, you are holy and humble and truly amazing! We humbly come to you and ask that You prepare our hearts to worship. In Jesus' name, Amen.

Song 3: "We Love You Lord"

Lesson 6

Transition 1: Today's verse is a great one. Let me read it to you. *Read Roman 1:16a from your Bible.* We can be bold in telling others about Jesus. There is power in the message of who Jesus is and how He came to save us. What if it seems tough to tell someone else? You don't need to be afraid because God is with you...ALWAYS!

Song 1: "Romans 16:19"

Transition 2: Be excellent at what is good! Do you know what is good? God is good, His ways are good! So, let's be excellent for God, and boldly live for Him. Stand firm on God's Word and choose to confidently live it out because we have the power of Jesus in us!

Song 2: "Don't Ever Stop"

Transition 3: Lord, how awesome You are! You help us stand firm and boldly tell others about You. There truly is nothing to fear when we trust and depend on You. In Jesus' name, Amen.

Song 3: "Do Not Fear"

Lesson 7

Transition 1: Are you ready to celebrate?! Jesus is ALIVE! Last week, we learned that Jesus died on the cross for your sins and mine. But friends, the story doesn't end there! Three days later, He rose from the dead. Our God is alive! Oh happy day, because today we worship our risen Savior, JESUS!

Song 1: "Happy Day"

Transition 2: We raise up holy hands to worship our holy, amazing Savior, Jesus!

Song 2: "Unchanging"

Transition 3: Lord, help our hearts to be focused only on You as we lift Your name on high.

Song 3: "Lord I Lift Your Name on High"

Lesson 8

Transition 1: Worship...what are some ways we can worship God? Can we worship God through prayer? Serving? What about obeying God's word? YES! Let's never stop worshipping our AWESOME GOD!

Song 1: "Don't Ever Stop"

Transition 2: When I think of everything God has done, I cannot help but worship and obey ALL He says! He sent His son, Jesus, to save us; He keeps ALL His promises, He is faithful, loving, powerful, and He is God!

Song 2: “Happy Day”

Transition 3: Only Jesus... *(pause)* Can you finish the thought? *(Allow kids to answer)* Only Jesus is... Only Jesus is worthy of our worship.

Song 3: “Only Jesus”

Lesson 9

Transition 1: Truth. Do you know what is 100% truth? God and His Word are truth. It tells us in John 14:6 that Jesus is the Way, the TRUTH, and the Life. If Jesus is the leader of your life, then His truth should be shining in you!

Song 1: “Shine”

Transition 2: What is the opposite of being truthful? (Lying) We’re often tempted to lie. What can we do when Satan tempts us to sin? Remember the TRUTH of God’s Word! Romans 16:19 says to be excellent at what is good *(do hand motions)* and to be innocent of evil! Let’s do what is good right now by praising God!

Song 2: “Romans 16:19”

Transition 3: Jesus, You are truth, You are my Savior, You are everything. In Jesus’ name, Amen.

Song 3: “Only Jesus”

Lesson 10

Transition 1: Show me how you stand firm! *(stomp feet down)* Hmm... nope, you’re missing something, and without it you will get knocked right over! *(hand a student a Bible)* Now they can stand firm against anything! We can be excellent at doing good and innocent of evil. *(do hand motions)*

Song 1: “Romans 16:19”

Transition 2: Standing firm means we know God’s Word and we choose to obey it. We must choose to DO what it says! Friends, let’s choose to be all in for Jesus!

Song 2: “Give Me a J”

Transition 3: Let’s pray. Lord, we choose to worship You now, to raise our hands and our voices to You and You alone. In Jesus’ name, Amen.

Song 3: “Unchanging”

Lesson 11

Transition 1: Do you know what grace is? Grace is something we don’t deserve and haven’t earned. Like when Jesus died on the cross so our sins could be forgiven; that was God’s grace and gift to us! Just like our verse for today, Ephesians 2:8-9, tells us it’s not about you or me or how many good things we do. It’s about who Jesus is and the amazing thing He did for us.

Song 1: “Happy Day”

Transition 2: Think about ALL Jesus has done for you. *(pause)* Doesn’t it make you want to go out and serve Him with everything you’ve got?! Go out and tell others about Jesus. Help a neighbor. Be a friend to that lonely kid at school. Be good to your brother or sister. Take a meal to the homeless. You might be little, but you can do big things when you choose to serve our great God!

Song 2: “Don’t Ever Stop”

Transition 3: Jesus is the one and only true God! Thank You, Lord, for giving us this time to worship You.

Song 3: “We Love You Lord”

Lesson 12

Transition 1: We have learned a lot of amazing things about Jesus this quarter. True or False: I did something great and that’s why my sins are forgiven. (False!) Why? Jesus died on the cross and rose

from the dead, that's why! You don't have to try to be good enough, friends, you only need to believe in Jesus and live for Him! That is the one and only way to heaven.

Song 1: "Tell the World"

Transition 2: We learned something else pretty amazing: who is always with you? (Jesus!) What about when life gets really scary or hard? (Yes, He is always with you!) What about when things are great, and you forget how much you need Jesus; is He with you then? (Yes!) God's promises are always true, always!

Song 2: "Romans 16:19"

Transition 3: Lord, these next few minutes are all about You. All we want to do is worship You, Jesus!

Song 3: "Unchanging"

Lesson 1

Transition 1: It's time to jump right into this new quarter and even though the lessons may change, and the weather may change, we have a God who never changes! His plans are the same, and His desire to use us in those plans remains. He could do it all Himself, but He chooses not to. Why not? It's like someone who plays a masterpiece on a broken instrument, the instrument doesn't look good, but the musician looks amazing. When God uses us, it isn't us who looks good - it's always HIM! Let's take advantage of being used for kingdom purposes and jump right into this new quarter!

Song 1: "Jump"

Transition 2: Have you guys ever been to the grocery store on "Sample Day"? You know, that's the day they give away all those free food samples. Why do you think they do that? *Allow for answers.* They are trying to introduce you to the item, in hopes that you will buy it. Well, in a way, when you become a Christian, you become a small sample of what God is like. We might be tempted to think it's impossible to tell others about Jesus, but when you realize that how you act and talk is a sample of who He is, then you will realize that nothing is impossible - including showing others who Jesus is!

Song 2: "Nothing is Impossible"

Transition 3: Why do we want to introduce people to Jesus? The whole world needs Jesus! He is the only one that can save people from their sin and literally conquer sin and death. He's also faithful through all of life's storms! Let's sing a song about the great things this hero of heaven has done!

Song 3: "Great Things"

Lesson 2

Transition 1: We are learning a lot about the miracles Jesus did! The reason Jesus did so many miracles was to show that He alone is God. Once people understand that He is God, then they can see that He alone can forgive their sins because any sin we do is against Him. No one else can forgive your sins, not a priest, not a teacher, not your parents - only God. That's because there is only one way to God and it's through His forgiveness of your sin!

Song 1: "One Way"

Transition 2: Because God is the only source of all power, we need to praise Him for who He is and what He has done. Who is He? *Allow for answers: Creator! Sustainer! Savior!* And what has He done? *Allow for answers.* Since His great deeds never end, our praise should be endless as well! Let's sing "Endless Praise" and remember that as we sing it, we are praising Him because He was the light before the sun was even made!

Song 2: "Endless Praise"

Transition 3: We know that God is great and powerful, now let's sing a song about it!

Song 3: "No One Higher"

Lesson 3

Transition 1: Let's say I was walking along, and I needed some help. If there was a dead guy and a living guy sitting on a bench (ok, the dead guy was laying.....), which one would be able to help me? Right! Only the living guy could help me. Well, every other world religion has a founder of their religion who is dead. Our founder, Jesus, is very much alive! Jesus did die, with the sin of the world on Him, and He was buried, but He rose again and appeared to more than 500 people! Scripture then tells us that after being with those people for 40 days, Jesus went back to heaven where He sits next to God the Father, and He works in our lives to this very day. He can do that because He is alive! Let's remember that God is alive!

Song 1: "God is Alive"

Transition 2: One way we know for sure that God is real, alive, and working is that He not only saves people from their sin when they realize they have offended a Holy God with their sinful lives, but He then changes them into the reflection of His Son. Do you know that the moon actually has no light of its own? How can we see it at night then? It's because it is reflecting the light of the sun. Can you look directly at the sun? No way - it would hurt your eyes because it is so powerful. But you *can* look directly at the moon. In the same way, when God saves us, He then starts to change us to reflect His Son's image in our lives. Let's celebrate our generous God who takes the time to change us.

Song 2: "Changed"

Transition 3: Sometimes it's hard to follow Jesus and do what He says. We have to remember that obeying Jesus isn't what saves us, but it does honor Him. Before we are saved, it is all about trying hard to not break the law, but when we realize that we are sinners and can't keep all the laws in the Bible, then we see our need for Jesus and the cross. Jesus took the punishment for our sins so now instead of worrying about not breaking the laws, it's more about not breaking His heart. That's one way to stay close to Him.

Song 3: "Close"

Lesson 4

Transition 1: Have you ever had something bad happen and you wondered how God could allow such a bad thing to happen? I had surgery last year on my shoulder (*feel free to insert a personal story here*) because I fell on the ice. God could have totally helped me not to fall, but He didn't. I had to have surgery, and I had to go to physical therapy for six long months. But, during my physical therapy appointments, I got a chance to share the Gospel with my therapist! Even when things seemed bad, God was doing something good. I just had to trust Him! Even when the world might say things are bad (and we might agree), God is still up to something good. That's because every good thing comes from Him!

Song 1: "Every Good Thing"

Transition 2: Many people put their hope in their looks, their achievements, their sports, their possessions... but they soon realize that they can lose those things and lose their hope. We can trust Jesus to be our hope and there is no one He can't save - as long as they admit their sin, repent from it, and ask Jesus to be their Leader. Really, nothing is impossible for Him, including saving sinners and being their source of hope!

Song 2: "Nothing is Impossible"

Transition 3: Let's remember the one who never leaves us!! He is with us through every trial, and scripture tells us He will somehow bring something good out of every storm!! He is the Hero of heaven and responsible for every great thing!

Song 3: "Great Things"

Lesson 5

Transition 1: If someone gave you one million dollars and then asked if they could have \$10 back, what would you say? Of course, you would say, "Yes!!" They gave you the money to start with, and you have so much, you'll never miss \$10!! When Jesus took the punishment for our sin, He literally gave us an uncountable amount of mercy and grace. Now He asks us to give mercy (free forgiveness) and grace (favor) to anyone who asks. Why shouldn't we? We are sitting with an uncountable amount - it's like being asked for \$10 when you have a million!! Based on what He did for us, we should be moved to do that for others!!

Song 1: "Movin' Me"

Transition 2: We live in a world and a culture where everyone thinks they should be served. We are takers, not givers. It says a lot to the watching world when kids like you offer to give with no thought of getting anything back for it. It's one way we can jump into our world and let others know who Jesus is!

Song 2: "Jump"

Transition 3: Serving others is also something Jesus did all the time, and He did it very well. When we serve others, we are more like Him. If you are 5 feet tall and you walk into a room and everyone is 7 feet tall, except for one person who is also 5 feet tall, who do you think you would stand closest to? You bet - you would stand next to the 5-foot-tall person because you have something in common with them. When we start to serve like Jesus, we become more like Him and have more in common with Him. The result? We feel closer to Him!

Song 3: “Close”

Lesson 6

Transition 1: If someone saved your life and then told you to follow them, would you trust them more because they just saved your life? You bet you would!! Why would they save your life and then lead you down a bad path? Jesus offers salvation to anyone who admits that they are sinners and wants Jesus to be the Lord of their life. “Lord” means that He is in charge, so what He says goes - even if we don’t understand it. We can trust the one who died for us and stand firm for Him by not denying Him and following Him even when we don’t feel like it. By doing these things, we are offering praise to His name. Based on who He is, and what He’s done, our praise for Him should be endless!!

Song 1: “Endless Praise”

Transition 2: There are a lot of distractions that will come at us when we try to keep our focus on who Jesus is (He is God!) and what He’s done (on that cross). Sometimes it may feel like there is no way out of a situation, but we know that Jesus can make a way where there is none. That’s because Jesus IS God and as God He owns everything in the universe. The Bible tells us that nature listens to His voice, demons bow down to Him, and the lost are saved. Jesus is power!! Let’s remember that as we sing this next song, “WaveWalker”!!

Song 2: “WaveWalker”

Transition 3: One way to gain strength in tough situations is to think about what you KNOW about God. This is His universe, so that means He is in charge. Some people believe that God made the universe, but then He wound it up like a clock or a toy and let go, and He is no longer in control of what happens here. The Bible tells us that is not true. In Colossians 1, we see that Jesus is holding all things together. If He were to let go, it would all be gone! When we think about the great things we know to be true about Jesus, it makes us feel more peaceful knowing that He is in charge.

Song 3: “Great Things”

Lesson 7

Transition 1: 1 Corinthians 15 is the chapter of the Bible that gives us proof of the greatest miracle in history! Jesus died on the cross, but then He rose from the dead. How do we know that? Certain people saw Him alive and wrote about it. In fact, Jesus appeared to more than 500 people after He rose from the dead, AND He appeared to them for 40 days! He didn’t just appear to them, He taught them, ate with them, and lived with them. Everyone knew that it was true! We need to have confidence in the fact that our God is alive!

Song 1: “God is Alive”

Transition 2: It is important that God is alive because it means that when Jesus died on that cross with all our sin, God was satisfied. That means that anyone who admits their sinfulness and asks Jesus to take their sin, that sin is all forgiven because God has accepted the sacrifice that Jesus made. All our sins are forgiven - past, present, and future. But Jesus doesn’t stop there. The Bible says that believers are given a helper - the Holy Spirit (who IS God, too!) to live inside of them and change them to become more like Jesus. Let’s celebrate all that Jesus has done for us as we allow Him to change us into His image.

Song 2: “Changed”

Transition 3: When we think about the names of great people, Jesus’ name needs to be in the #1 spot. There is no one higher! Because He is the highest authority, there is no one and nothing that can take us away from Him once we are saved through Him.

Song 3: “No One Higher”

Lesson 8

Transition 1: If you were in an airplane and the pilot asked you to fly it, could you? No way!! You'd need some training, and you'd need to listen to everything the pilot said to do and do it! In the same way, we are carrying a message of salvation to a hurting world, and it can feel impossible. God says if we obey His message and don't try to change it, there is nothing that is impossible for Him!!

Song 1: "Nothing Is Impossible"

Transition 2: It's easy to obey and follow Jesus when things are going good for us, but what happens when trials and struggles and seriously bad news comes into our lives? Does that shake us a little, make us a little 'wavy' in our walk? Cheer loudly if you are thankful for what Jesus did on the cross! Cheer if you love that He died for you! (*Everyone should be cheering*) Now think about it - that was a murder. The people that followed Jesus stood there that day were not thinking that this was the best thing to ever happen! But here we are years later saying that it was and cheering for it. We need to remember that God knows best, and He is good, and when the storms come, if we remember that and continue to obey Him, we can be wave walkers through the storm!

Song 2: "WaveWalker"

Transition 3: There is really only one response to a God who remains faithful to us when we are unfaithful to Him so often... we need to thank Him by raising a Hallelujah!

Song 3: "Raise a Hallelujah"

Lesson 9

Transition 1: Let's say that I let you take care of my dog. He's so cute and fluffy. I told you when to walk him, when to feed him, how to snuggle him, and how to train him. Because he's my dog, do you think you should listen to my instructions? Well, the Bible says that when we become God's children by seeing that He is Lord, we now need to do things that we might not understand or even agree with, but because God is in charge, we need to listen. Because I am so thankful for what He did for me, I should WANT to listen. The love that the Father has, the wisdom that He has, and His perfection, should move me to do things that I might not otherwise have chosen, like always telling the truth! Let's let God's truth move us to do even those hard things!

Song 1: "Movin' Me"

Transition 2: How many of you have rules in your family that you don't like? *Allow them to list a few.* If your mom tells you not to watch a certain movie and then you are at your friend's house and they want to watch that movie and you say, "Ok", what are you saying? You are basically telling your friend that your parents don't know what they are talking about, and they make up silly rules that shouldn't be listened to. Now, when we take a rule of God's and disobey it, like telling the truth, we are telling the watching world the same thing. We are saying that God doesn't know what He's talking about, and His rules are silly and shouldn't be listened to. God's rules, just like our parents' rules, are there for our protection. We need to remember that when we tell the truth, we are obeying God and telling the world that even His rules are good. After all, every good thing comes from Him!

Song 2: "Every Good Thing"

Transition 3: When you disobey your parents, you don't stop being their kid, but you do damage the closeness you have with them. The same is true with God. If you've trusted in Jesus for the forgiveness of your sin, then when you disobey Him, you are damaging the closeness you have with Him. Let's commit to obeying God's rules - even telling the truth - so we can be close to Him!

Song 3: "Close"

Lesson 10

Transition 1: If I was sitting here with a raisin and I told you it was a Skittle candy, what would you say? You would say, "No, it's not, it's a raisin!" In the same way, many religions can make claims as to who God is, whether there's a heaven or a hell, and how to be saved. The reality is, if one religion is true, then the others are not. If your religion says you are saved by your works and mine says you are saved NOT by your works but by grace, those two cannot both be right. The Bible tells us that Jesus is the

ONLY WAY to heaven. History confirms the writings in the Bible, archaeological digs keep finding evidence for what is in the Bible, prophecies keep coming true that were written in the Bible, and lives are constantly changed by people who trust in Jesus. What does all that mean? Let's celebrate the ONE WAY to heaven - Jesus!!

Song 1: "One Way"

Transition 2: Since we are holding the truth, we need to jump into our world and let them know about Jesus! We need to proclaim His name as great, so people everywhere can hear the true way to heaven and the praise for His name can grow!

Song 2: "Jump"

Transition 3: Let's celebrate the God of great things - He truly is the hero of heaven!!

Song 3: "Great Things"

Lesson 11

Transition 1: If an international movie star or sports hero (*you can ask the crowd for a name or just use someone who is in the limelight right now*) were to ask you to hold his sweaty shirt, you would totally do it. If He asked you to get his teammates some water, you would do it. Some of you would be willing to lick the bottom of his shoes, just because he is wearing them! Now if a stranger on the street asked you to do the same thing, you might not be so willing. The desire to serve them isn't based on what they are asking, but on how you feel about the one who is asking. Based on who Jesus is, and what He has done, we should allow that to change us into people that consider it an honor to serve the King of Kings by serving others.

Song 1: "Changed"

Transition 2: Serving other people isn't something that comes naturally to us. We like to be served. Some people are harder to serve than others - especially those that aren't as nice to us. Jesus gives us an example to follow when He washes the feet of the man that would lead people to kill Him. He knew the man would do that, and He still served him. Wow! Because this looks so different from how people usually act, this will cause others to look at us differently and when they do - we can point them to Jesus. When we don't let people pull us down, but instead we step out and serve them, we rise above the waves!! How many people can you see under the water? None. How many can you see above it? All of them!!! Let's be wave walkers in how we serve, so others see us and are drawn to Jesus!!

Song 2: "WaveWalker"

Transition 3: We should serve others because of the greatness of the name that asked us to. When Jesus says, "Serve others as I have served you," we need to remember that there is no higher name that we need to answer to.

Song 3: "No One Higher"

Lesson 12

Transition 1: It's REVIEW week! So, let's review a few truths: Who is Jesus? (God) All sin is against who? (God) Who is the only person who can truly forgive sins? (God/Jesus) Why? (Only the person sinned against can forgive the sin and if it's God's laws they broke, then every person needs to seek forgiveness through Him)

Bring two students up on stage. Say, "If I lied to _____ (point to first student), can _____ (point to second student) forgive me? Why not? Because only _____ (point to first student) can forgive a sin done to him". Have students return to their spots.

In the same way, only God can forgive a sin done against Him and seeing as all sin is done against Him and we are all sinners, we all need forgiveness from God. Because Jesus IS God, that means that His dying for us offers us that forgiveness. That should result in endless praise!

Song 1: "Endless Praise"

Transition 2: Because God went to those great lengths to be with us and save us, we can trust all that He says to us. Having faith isn't knowing what will happen tomorrow, but it is knowing who is in charge

of tomorrow. Our God is alive and active and already in charge of tomorrow, which means we have nothing to worry about today!

Song 2: “God is Alive”

Transition 3: Let’s remember that God saves everyone who turns to Him and makes Him the Lord of their life. Even our made-up movie heroes can’t do that. They might be able to save one person or a few people, but not everyone who wants to can be saved at one time!! That makes Him the true hero of heaven, and He alone can do those kinds of great things!

Song 3: “Great Things”

Eternal Life (Heaven) — The perfect place where God and those who have accepted Jesus as their Savior will live forever.

Sin — Anything you think, say, or do that is against God. Not doing what God tells us to do in the Bible.

Eternal Death (Hell) — A place of punishment and eternal separation from God where Satan, demons, and unsaved people will live forever.

Savior (Jesus) — The One who saves us.

Saved — Freed forever from the punishment of sin.

Forgive — To cancel a debt or punishment.

Surrender — To give up your way of doing things.

Romans 3:23


For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God,

For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith — and this not from yourselves, it is the gift of God — not by works, so that no one can boast.




Hebrews 9:22b


